2014 HIGHLIGHTS

- Improved bike facilities on St. Landry and St. Mary
- Secured EPA technical assistance grant to develop local food economy
- Passed several changes to the litter laws
- Secured private funding to fund enforcement position and several other Project Front Yard initiatives
- Rebranded adopt a road program to "Embrace a Space"
- MPO (Metropolitan Planning Organization) adopted a Complete Streets policy

EFFORTS UNDERWAY

- Awarded Transportation Alternatives Program grant to help build streetscape along Bertrand Drive, engineering to begin in February
- Began work to develop a Return on Investment Tool to accurately and comprehensively calculate ROI on public infrastructure improvements
- Pursuing construction of a **new river crossing** at South City Parkway
- Installation of **new bus shelter facilities**
- Unveiling of a neighborhood toolkit
- Began work on revisions to the **vehicle for hire ordinance** to improve service in Lafayette
